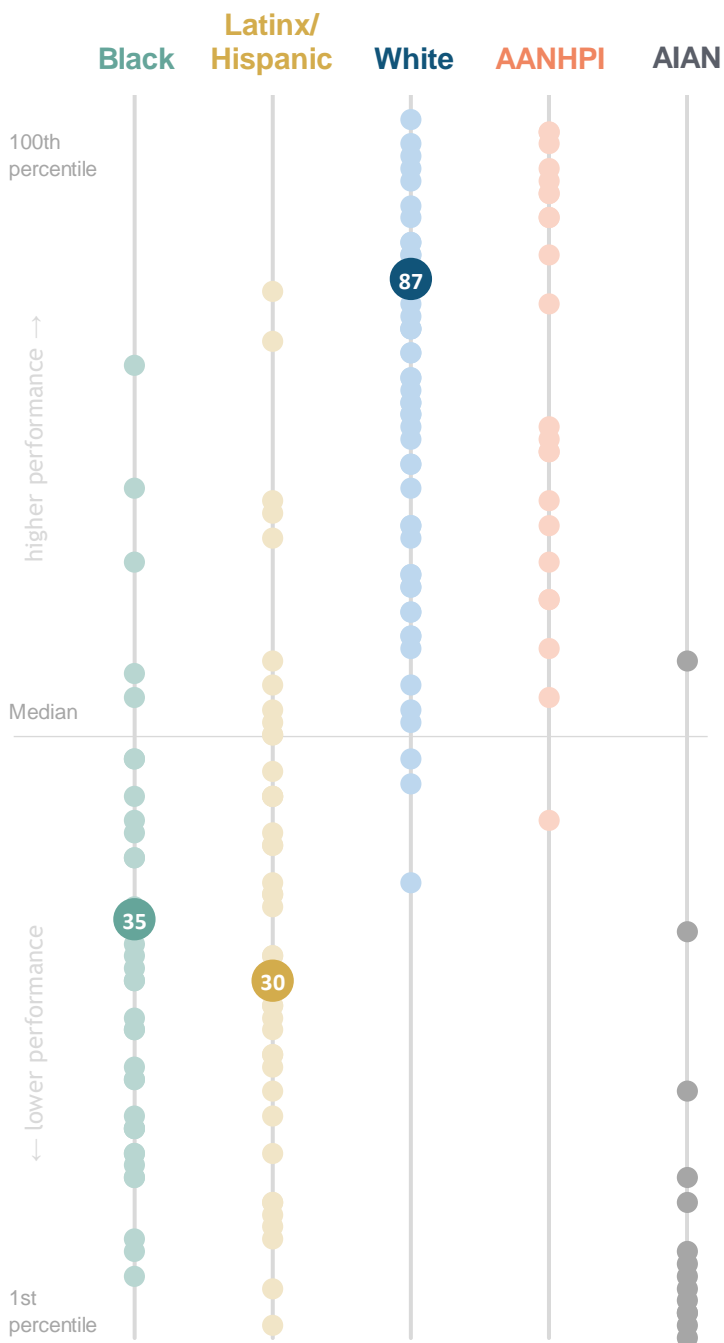


Health Equity in Delaware
